Hi Jeremy--

Mr. Bradshaw is correct that the cemetery on parcel 18726 has not been verified. However, we do have a report of a cemetery in that location and would like to see the notation remain in the GIS system. There is nothing in Mr. Heiser's notes that indicate he looked for the site. (There were many more sites reported than he could personally investigate.) If no evidence of the site is found, our notes, associated with the cemetery code E13.2, will indicate that the cemetery was reported but not found.

Do you know if Mr. Bradshaw has information indicating that a surveyor looked for the cemetery in the general location indicated on the GIS and did not find it? If so, I would like to get a copy to include in our files.

It is possible that the visible signs of the gravesites have been destroyed--by timbering or simply time. Many of the sites were marked only by fieldstones and are difficult to spot if you haven't seen many of them before. The 1989 report indicates that this site was overgrown and not easily identifiable.

According to Will Heiser's notes, the cemetery is reported to be the family cemetery of a Carter family. If Mr. Bradshaw can provide deed book and page references for the title trail, it might be possible to determine if there has ever been a Carter owner of the parcel.

Even if the surface indications of a cemetery are gone, the burials are still protected by state law. In a case like this one, where the cemetery was not found, any disturbance of the area where the cemetery was reported to be should be done with great care so that the subtle, but very recognizable evidence of graves will be noticed if they are present.

In short, we would like to keep the cemetery notation on the parcel. I have asked the Planning office to inform the developer that CCHA would like to investigate the site. If no evidence of the cemetery can be found, we will indicate that in the files. This is not an unusual situation. There are a number of other sites like this in the county.
