Size and location of property (water body, road name/number, town, etc.): The project site is located on Mt. Gilead Church Road, approximately 1.3 miles from the interchange of US 64 near Pittsboro, Chatham County, North Carolina and is identified as "Parker Springs Subdivision". Aquatic features on site drain to the Cape Fear River Basin.

Description of projects area and activity: This permit verifies permanent impacts associated with this project in the amount of 243 linear feet of stream channel exhibiting important aquatic functions, 13 linear feet of stream not exhibiting important aquatic functions, and 0.009 acres of wetlands. Mitigation is required for impacts to streams exhibiting important aquatic functions (see Permit Conditions below).

Permit Condition: In order to compensate for impacts to <u>243 linear feet warm water streams</u>, the permittee shall make payment to the North Carolina Ecosystem Enhancement Program (NC EEP) in the amount determined by the NC EEP, sufficient to perform the restoration of <u>371 linear feet of warm water streams</u> in the <u>Cape Fear River Basin</u>, Cataloging Unit <u>03030003</u>.

Construction within jurisdictional areas on the property shall begin only after the permittee has made full payment to the NC EEP and provided a copy of the payment documentation to the Corps, and the NC EEP has provided written confirmation to the Corps that it agrees to accept responsibility for the mitigation work required, in compliance with the MOU between the North Carolina Department of Environment and Natural Resources and the United States Army Corps of Engineers, Wilmington District, dated November 4, 1998.
