Dear Mr. McLeod:

On June 20, 2008, S&EC personnel conducted a site meeting with Mr. James Lastinger of the US Army Corps of Engineers. At this meeting the Corps of Engineers confirmed that Feature A is an important, perennial stream, and determined that it will require 1:1 mitigation for impacts. Mr. Lastinger further confirmed that the wetland within the floodplain of Feature A delineated with flags 12 through 30 is a jurisdictional wetland. No other streams, ponds, or wetlands located on-site were claimed under the jurisdiction of the USACE.


