Lynn,

Following our conversation about the Phase 6 South Archeological issues, below is the revised language for the response to the CUP conditions, paragraph 16.

16. Archaeological Survey

An “Intensive Cultural Resource Investigation” was performed for Briar Chapel in August of 2006, which has been previously provided to Chatham County. Based on the findings from the report, there are no cemeteries on the site associated with Phase 6 South. There was one site mentioned in the 2006 investigation, referred to as 31CH823/823, that was located within Phase 6 South. The site was not eligible for the National Register. NC SHPO concurred with this finding. Since the time of that report, this historically insignificant site (consisting of remains of a delapidated building) has been disassembled and no longer exists. The developer has retained certain non-decayed bricks and building materials from the site with the intent of possibly incorporating the same into a commemoration in a nearby open space at a later time.**
