I am strongly not in favor of locating a 200 ft tall cell tower in the middle of a residential area, which is what is happening. I realize there is very little residents can do however. If I had known this would happen in this part of Chatham County, we never would have purchased land and moved here. I am a) concerned about health effects from this continuous source of radiation and b) opposed to the fact that the county will be allowing an area to be re-zoned "light industrial" in the middle of a residential area, and c) concerned about the aesthetic ruin to the rural landscape.
