Location description: The 107 acre (approximate) site is located immediately northeast of the Mt. Gilead Church Road/Rabbit Run intersection and consists of Chatham County PINs #17441, 17440 and 17425.

Description of projects area and activity: This authorization is for temporary and permanent impacts to jurisdictional streams associated with the construction of a residential subdivision as follows: Crossing #1: Stream F (Impact #1) 92.4-linear feet of permanent impact for the installation of one (1) 66 lf RCP culvert and 15 linear feet of rip rap for a velocity dissipation pad and 20 linear feet of temporary impacts for dewatering. Crossing #2; Stream G (Impact #2) 110-linear feet of permanent impact for the installation of two (2) 60-inch culverts. The stream associated with Crossing #1 (Stream F) was determined to have minimal aquatic function and did not require compensatory mitigation. Crossing #2 is verified based on a preliminary design (see special condition below).

Special Conditions:

1. The applicant must submit final plans for Crossing #2, prior to construction of Phase 2. The applicant must receive written notification from the Corps prior to any discharge associated with Crossing #2. If the permanent impacts are 150 linear feet or greater, compensatory mitigation will be required.

This verification will remain valid until the expiration date identified below unless the nationwide authorization is modified. suspended or revoked. If, prior to the expiration date identified below, the nationwide permit authorization is reissued and/or modified, this verification will remain valid until the expiration date identified below, provided it complies with all requirements of the modified nationwide permit. If the nationwide permit authorization expires or is suspended, revoked, or is modified, such that the activity would no longer comply with the terms and conditions of the nationwide permit, activities which have commenced (i.e., are under construction) or are under contract to commence in reliance upon the nationwide permit, will remain authorized provided the activity is completed within twelve months of the date of the nationwide permit's expiration, modification or revocation, unless discretionary authority has been exercised on a case-by-case basis to modify, suspend or revoke the authorization.
