

Halt Is Called To Protest At Center

RALEIGH, Feb. 14 (AP)—Negro college students said today they would halt demonstrations against segregated eating facilities in Raleigh's Cameron Village shopping center.

The group, representing youngsters from Shaw University and St. Augustine College, said the sitdown protests would end pending disposal of trespassing charges levelled Friday and Saturday against 43 students.

In a brief statement, the "intelligence committee of the Shaw-St. Augustine student movement" said:

"The student movement will discontinue activities in Cameron Village not through intimidation, but pending court action in the cases of the 43 students arrested.

"However, the movement will continue at the four (downtown) stores on Fayetteville Street . . ."

The cases are scheduled to be tried in city court Feb. 25.
