

# Jury Trial Is Asked By Student

Donald R. Lyons, A&T College student involved in the Feb. 6 sitdown racial disturbance downtown, asked for a jury trial yesterday and was bound over to Guilford Superior Court.

Appearing before Judge Hampton Howerton Jr. of Municipal County Court, Lyons made the move toward higher court as soon as the case was called for trial. He is accused of assaulting a white man, Charles Leon Loye of 724 Florida St., with his fists at Kress store.

A \$100 fine and costs was assessed against Lonnie W. Lockhart, 29, of 200-A Gillespie St., for speeding 80 miles an hour in a 55-mile zone and for illegally using a red light in the grill of his car.

Alan Charles Adams, 16, of 1900 Madison Ave., was bound over to Superior Court on a car theft charge. Also sent to the higher court was the case of Robert B. Tucker, 44, of Route 6, Winston-Salem, who appealed when he was convicted of driving on the wrong side of the road.

Two-month active terms were given two 21-year-old local men for stealing automobile hubcaps Feb. 24. They were Robert G. Meetze of 1318 Florida St. and Herman F. Reese Jr. of 2423 High Point Road.

A one-year license revocation was recommended against Rufus Albert Morgan, 38, of 1511 Barto Place, who was fined \$125 and costs for driving intoxicated.

Robert J. Brakefield, 40, of 3910 Stanley Drive, was fined \$75 and costs for reckless driving. Seth O. Hickerson, 30, of 732 Jennifer St., was fined \$50 and costs for carrying a concealed pistol.
