

Two Sentenced For Trespassing

RALEIGH, April 26 (A)—Judge Jack Hooks of Kenly today imposed 30-day jail sentences and \$25 fines on two Negro college students arrested during a protest against segregated lunch counters:

The two—James A. Fox of Washington and Albert Sampson of Everett, Mass.—were convicted in Wake Superior Court last Thursday of trespassing.

Judge Hooks suspended their 30-day jail sentences last week although the law provides that sentences may only be suspended with the consent of the defendants.

In changing the sentences, Judge Hooks said he was advised that the students did not wish to consent.

Defense attorney Samuel Mitchell immediately gave notice of appeal of the new sentences to the State Supreme Court and the students posted bonds totaling \$600 each.

If the two students eventually lose their case in the courts, the judge's action means they will have to serve their jail terms.
