

Six Convicted Of Trespass

CONCORD, April 29 (A)—Six Negro college students charged with trespassing when they attempted to gain service at a white lunch counter were convicted in Mayor's Court here today.

Judge Robert L. Warren sentenced the six to 30-day sentences, suspended for six months on payment of \$25 fines. He also stipulated they not violate any trespass law during the six months.

Five of the students appealed. They are Jesse Davis Stanback, Earl William Ford, Pearlier Pickens, Gwendolyn Dean, and Tony Edward Ward.

The sixth student, Marlene Eloise Johnson, paid her fine.

The Barber Scotia College students all pleaded innocent to the charges which stemmed from a sitdown protest at Williams Candy Kitchen here April 11.
