Of the six who aired their views, four said they were for closing the library rather than integrating it. Two said they would be guided by the result of the referendum.

There is mounting feeling on the issue. Dr. Samuel Newman who leads the liberal group preferring integration to no library, has written to City Manager Edward Temple saying that he is chagrined over the closing and that the peoples of Asia and Africa will, be informed about the Danville situation as all American issues of this type are carefully scrutinized.
