PUBLIC HEARINGS

<u>07/0501.18-15 Consideration of an Amendment to a Coastal Development Permit for the Manhattan Beach Open Volleyball Tournament to Allow Additional VIP Bleacher Seating and Consideration of a Revised Event Name for the 2007 Manhattan Beach Open</u>

Dave Williams, Director of Tour Operations for the Association of Volleyball Professionals (AVP) clarified the two items that the AVP had requested be changed to the existing contract for the 2007 Manhattan Beach Open; additional VIP seating to be constructed on the west side of the sand; and the ability to keep the same naming rights as exercised beginning 2001.

A discussion was held between Council and **Mr. Williams** further clarifying the height restrictions on the west side bleachers and naming rights. They also discussed the revenue sources for the event and affect of the name as it related directly to revenue.

Councilmember Ward referred to an article in the Daily Breeze that day and stated his concerns about making changes to a contract that had already been agreed upon and the lack of time available should there be any appeal to the changes.

Mayor Tell opened the Public Hearing at 7:09 p.m.

Dennis Duke Noor, Hermosa Beach Resident, commented that the real issue regarding this amendment is the timing and process. He stated that if someone wanted to appeal the amendment to the Coastal Commission, there would not be enough time and that it would be a violation if the Council chooses to change what was already voted on.

Bill Eisen, 3500 Block of Crest Drive, stressed that the amendment would significantly affect coastal resources such as the view corridor. He added that, according to the Public Resources Code, any action on the approved permit is legally "stayed" until a decision can be made by the Coastal Commission. He forewarned the Council that a penalty of up to \$15,000 a day could be imposed for violating the Coastal Act; that as a sponsor, the City could be liable; and urged the Council to abide by the permit that was issued.

Viet Ngo, No Address Provided, expressed his concern about giving the name of the City of Manhattan Beach to **Leonard Amado of the AVP** for the purpose of private enterprise when it belongs to the 36,000 residents of the City.

Mayor Tell closed the Public Hearing at 7:19 p.m.

There was a second discussion between Council and **Mr. Williams** regarding revenue sources at the event, untimely renegotiations of the contract and issues with the sub-committee.

Mayor Tell reiterated the fact that the current contract was for one year (2007) only and that the City planned to maintain local control of the event.

City Attorney Robert Wadden stated that the City would not be liable for any fines/penalties

that may possibly arise from the event by the Coastal Commission.

<u>MOTION</u>: Mayor Pro Tem Aldinger moved to <u>adopt</u> Resolution No. 6105 and direct the City Manager to amend the 2007 Manhattan Beach Open agreement accordingly.

Mayor Tell added that local control of the event would be maintained by Manhattan Beach and stressed that the City would continue to partner with the AVP to maintain an event that is agreeable to them and the residents of Manhattan Beach. He also stated that the subcommittee would maintain open communication with Council on all discussions with the AVP.

Councilmember Montgomery emphasized that the Council is not selling the City's name; they are granting permission to use the name for one year only.

Mayor Tell called for a second to the motion.

<u>MOTION</u>: Mayor Pro Tem Aldinger moved to <u>adopt</u> Resolution No. 6105 and direct the City Manager to amend the 2007 Manhattan Beach Open agreement accordingly. The motion was seconded by Councilmember Montgomery and passed by the following roll call vote:

<u>07/0703.17</u> Consideration to Award a One Year Contract to All Cities Management Services (ACMS) to Provide Crossing Guard Services (Annual Cost of \$301,800)

Police Lieutenant Derrick Abell presented a PowerPoint presentation on the current Crossing Guard program operated by the Police Department and the benefits of out-sourcing this program. He also spoke about the research that was involved with selecting All Cities Management Services (ACMS) as the contracted provider of service, their credentials, history and excellent track record.

Following Lt. Abell's presentation, Council held discussion with **ACMS General Manager Baron Farewell** regarding the status of current Manhattan Beach crossing guards, employee benefits, training, job performance evaluations and certification.

The following individual spoke on this item:

Councilmember Montgomery was assured by **Mr. Farewell** that the current Manhattan Beach crossing guards would be retained at their current rate of pay. **Mr. Farewell** further explained that crossing guards are difficult to recruit because of the nature of the job and that they had no plans of dismissing any of the existing staff.

Councilmember Cohen expressed that she was in favor of awarding the contract to **ACMS**. She liked the fact that they did regular performance evaluations on the crossing guards and that they were involved in extensive training and certification. She expressed that their historical presence spoke volumes. She also stated that it would be more cost wise to outsource the service contract.

There was some reluctance shared by Mayor Pro Tem Aldinger as he likes the way the department is currently run through the Police Department but is willing to give **ACMS** a try on a temporary basis. He also commented on his concern regarding the increased cost of outsourcing the service.

Councilmember Ward acknowledged that there was a great deal of emotion tied to the service as the residents entrust their children to these individuals. He stated, however, that he believes that **ACMS** would be able to run the department more efficiently than the City could and the fact that they would retain the existing guards was applauded by him.

Mayor Tell stated that who better at doing the job than **ACMS**, the experts in the field. He asserted that their expertise was worth any extra monies that the City may have to spend. He also clarified that at the end of the one year contract if things weren't working out they would revisit the issue.

<u>MOTION</u>: Councilmember Ward moved to <u>approve</u> the award of a one year service contract to ACMS. The motion was seconded by Councilmember Cohen and passed by the following unanimous roll call vote:
