07/0807.22 Los Angeles County Librarian Don Gould Re Various Events

Los Angeles County Librarian Don Gould announced several upcoming events that will be held at the Manhattan Beach Library and reported that they will soon be receiving an upgrade to their information system line and new computers, both for the public and staff.

07/0807.23 Viet Ngo Re Alleged Corruption

Viet Ngo, No Address Provided, alleged that he and the other 36,000 residents of Manhattan Beach have been victimized by public corruption and urged the public to call the FBI for help.

Scott Gobble, Regional Manger of Public Affairs for Southern California Edison (SCE), announced that at next Tuesday's Farmers Market, SCE will be giving out free energy efficient light bulbs and encouraged everyone to come and get one.

In response to Councilmember Ward's question about these light bulbs, Mr. Gobble confirmed that while they do contain a chemical, they are 75% more efficient than regular bulbs. He also added that he would follow up with City Manger Dolan as to where the light bulbs can be disposed of for recycling.

#### **PUBLIC HEARINGS**

07/0807.19 Consideration of a Determination that the City is in Compliance With the Program Requirements of the 2007 Congestion Management Program (CMP) for Los Angeles County as Prepared by the Metropolitan Transportation Authority (MTA)

Assistant Planner Angelica Ochoa summarized the Congestion Management Program (CMP) communicating that the main goal of the CMP is to mitigate traffic impacts associated with new development. She explained that the Metropolitan Transit Authority (MTA) is the agency responsible for the CMP and that the City must meet the CMP requirements in order to continue to be eligible to receive Section 215 Gas Tax Funds. She conveyed that the three areas required to be reported are: the total number of units and square footage of new commercial development after subtracting demolitions; development activity for the reporting period; and highway monitoring data of the Rosecrans Avenue/Sepulveda Boulevard intersection. She pointed out that although the requirement to create "credits" has not yet been reinstated, the MTA still requires that each city monitor and report new development activity annually. Assistant Planner Ochoa concluded by reporting that last year there were 130 new residential constructions versus 131 demolitions; 39 multiple units were constructed versus 33 demolished; and 15,495 square feet of office space was constructed versus 20,964 being demolished.

Mayor Aldinger opened the Public Hearing at 8:12 p.m.

Viet Ngo, No Address Provided, alleged that the City's certificate of compliance has been submitted without truthful input and sold to the City of Commerce. He urged the Council and City Attorney to protect public money.

Mayor Aldinger closed the Public Hearing at 8:15 p.m.

Councilmember Ward emphasized that given the stringent rules that the City follows, he is confident that Manhattan Beach is in full compliance.

#### **GENERAL BUSINESS**

07/0807.20 Summary of Utility Underground District 05-6 Public Meeting Held to Review

Construction Design Plans

Senior Civil Engineer Stephanie Katsouleas addressed Council with a PowerPoint presentation of Utility Underground District 05-6 illustrating the boundaries (Marine Avenue to 15<sup>th</sup> Street and Highland Avenue to The Strand). She reviewed that this District was approved by a 63% majority, although, it was suspended for approximately 5 months pending the outcome of a lawsuit, in which the City prevailed. She reported that as the contractor was preparing to begin digging, it was discovered that improvements to the infrastructure would prevent vaults and trench lines from being installed; however, since monies were collected and bonds were sold before this discovery, the cost to residents was locked in while the utilities redesigned their facilities over the next ten months. She stated that because the first public meeting was poorly attended, the City provided extensive outreach for the second meeting and included an additional 10-day comment period in which she spoke with several residents regarding infrastructure plans near their homes.

Southern California Edison (SCE) Regional Manager of Public Affairs Scott Gobble reviewed SCE's design criteria and described some the factors that govern how underground systems are designed. In response to Councilmember Ward's question, Mr. Gobble explained that riser poles are placed in neighborhoods <u>adjacent</u> to those with Utility Undergrounding; that new poles are used in order to "start out fresh" and because of the considerable cost of the new equipment being placed on the pole; and that having 2 poles in the same area is the exception and only done when there are too many wires to be handled by one pole.

In response to a question on notification, Senior Civil Engineer Katsouleas explained that each resident in District 05-6 whose property will be affected by a riser pole, vent, etc. was specifically notified of what type of above-ground structure would be placed on or near their property. She also pointed out that new poles had to be placed wherever "mid span" wires were present.

Councilmember Tell conveyed that he and Mayor Pro Tem Montgomery walked several blocks in this District to see if it was possible to address specific concerns by repositioning some of the structures.

Council held discussion with **Mr. Gobble** determining that he does not believe that there will be a rapid change in electrical technology and that the useful life of utility poles varies.

Councilmember Tell cited that the City, in partnership with SCE, will be looking into the electrical system to determine where there is low capacity in order to avoid outages such as those that happened in the Tree Section last holiday season.

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Senior Civil Engineer Katsouleas continued her presentation summarizing the design changes and other above ground impacts, residential comments and concerns and parking options during construction.

It was determined during a brief discussion with Council that parking passes would be "car specific" by license plate, given out one month at a time and limited to the upper level at City Hall and the bottom level at Metlox.

In response to **Mr. Ngo's** comments, Mayor Pro Tem Montgomery clarified that the City prevailed against the Undergrounding lawsuit and that the City has no control over Proposition 218; it is governed by the State.

Councilmember Ward commented that the Undergrounding "argument" has long passed and that it is time to move forward while trying to mitigate issues such as the above ground structures, if possible.

Councilmember Tell emphasized that the Council does care; that the main issue is to make sure that the vents and riser poles are done in the most unobtrusive way; that the mistakes of District 2 are not repeated; that engineering wise, opting-out is just not possible; and that the City has to abide by Proposition 218.

Councilmember Cohen added that the City does not have a view ordinance and commended Senior Civil Engineer Katsouleas for her efforts on this project.

Mayor Aldinger pointed out the fact that out of approximately 75 people who were at the second public meeting, none are present this evening, and that speaks volumes. He further stated that he is satisfied with the way that District 6 is moving forward.

Mayor Aldinger moved to receive and file the subject report summarizing the public meeting held to address the revised design plans for Utility Undergrounding District 6 and approve a parking pass program to address the parking problem(s) that will be created as a result of the construction project.

Hearing no objection, it was so ordered.
