#### **Management Services:**

#### New Employee

Sona Kalapura is our new Environmental Programs Manager. She recently worked as an Analyst for the U.S. Government Accountability Office (GAO) in Los Angeles. # New Employees

<u>Police Officer Michael Levin</u> is a native of Minsk, Belarus. He immigrated to the United States with his family in 1996. He received his Bachelor's of Science degree in Computer Engineering from the University of California, Irvine, in 2006. While at the University, Michael was a member of the fencing team and competed in several USFA and college level tournaments. After graduation, Michael worked in the IT department for the City of Inglewood. He worked closely with the Inglewood Police Department which eventually led to his decision to pursue a law enforcement career.

Nan joined the Manhattan Beach Police Department in 1986 and was initially assigned to teach DARE. She was later assigned to the detective bureau's Fraud, Forgery, Narcotics and Vice Investigations. She was promoted to the rank of Sergeant in 1998 and has overseen Patrol operations, the SWAT Sniper Team, DARE Unit, and Trauma Support Team as well as five years as the Sergeant in charge of Training and Human Resources. The program she is most proud of is the Community Police Academy which brings citizens and police personnel together. This program generated positive feedback from everyone involved. She was awarded the Officer of the Year in 2006 for her efforts in building partnerships within our organization and the community,

Christian became a Deputy Sheriff with the Los Angeles County Sheriff's Department in 1995. He spent the next five years working a variety of assignments at two different jail facilities. In April of 2000, he began his career with the Manhattan Beach Police Department. Throughout his career, Christian has worked the following assignments: Beach Patrol, SWAT (Sniper), Use of Force Instructor, South Bay Platoon, Range Instructor, and Traffic (Motor) Officer. Christian recently earned a Bachelor of Arts degree from the Union Institute and University.

Ryan Small is another newly promoted Police Sergeant. Ryan began his career with the Manhattan Beach Police Department as a Police Communications Operator in 1990.
