SUBJECT: Consideration of the Parks and Recreation Commission Recommendation to

Approve an Off-Leash Dog Area at Polliwog Park

RECOMMENDATION:

Staff recommends that City Council approve the recommendation of the Parks and Recreation Commission to install an off-leash dog run area at Polliwog Park for general use by the public and dog obedience classes.

FISCAL IMPLICATION:

The total cost for the dog run is \$18,200 (attachment A). This project can be implemented in one phase or the installation be completed over two years in two phases. The first phase costs \$11,700. The second phase is to be completed in FY 2010/2011. Funds have not been budgeted for this project. If approved, the only source for funding would be the City Council Contingency Fund. There is a balance of \$50,000 in the City Council's Contingency Fund.

Annual operational cost of the proposed off-leash dog run area at Polliwog Park are estimated to be \$4,000.

- A. \$2,200 in labor for annual removal and replenishment of woodchips
- B. \$800-Mutt Mitt replacements
- C. \$500-Electrical power.
- D. \$500-Drinking water.

BACKGROUND:

In February 2005, the City opened an off-leash dog play area in Live Oak Park beyond the center field fence at Dorsey Field. The City Council made the off-leash area permanent in August of that year because of its great success. The dog run at Live Oak has had minimal problems and has become a social gathering place for many dog owners. When making Live Oak permanent, City Council directed staff to move the dog obedience classes from that site so more time would be available for the public. The Council also stated that if other locations are discovered for a dog run that don't impact the surrounding neighbors, that site should be brought forward for consideration. In December 2005, a site at Marine Avenue Park was brought forward to Council, considered and approved. In the three years since it was installed, there have been no problems related to the dog

run at Marine Avenue Park.

DISCUSSION:

Staff believes it has found an additional site that may also be suitable for an off-leash play area for dogs. The area is along the upper west walkway at Polliwog Park (see attachment B-site map). The area is rectangular in shape and would be comparable in size to the dog run at Live Oak Park.

Staff reviewed the area in Polliwog Park with the Dog Advisory Committee, who agreed to its suitability for an off-leash dog area. This site exists along a walkway that was approved for onleash dog walkthrough access in September 2008.

A notice was sent to the neighborhoods surrounding Polliwog Park, inviting them to the October 26, 2009 Parks and Recreation Commission meeting. On this notice was a map showing the approximate location of the proposed off-leash dog area.

On October 26, 2009, staff presented a proposal for the establishment of an off-leash dog area at Polliwog Park to the Parks and Recreation Commission. At this public meeting, the Parks and Recreation Commission took public testimony that supported the proposal. Staff has received one email from a resident with operational concerns that have been addressed in design of the area and rules and regulations governing dogs in Polliwog Park in general and proposed dog run specifically.

If approved as an off-leash play area, the Polliwog site would be operated with rules and policies similar to the Live Oak and Marine Avenue dog run areas. The Superintendent of Public Works has confirmed with staff his ability to implement this project within two months from approval.

If the Polliwog Park site is approved as an off-leash area for dogs, staff will monitor the area and document any concerns. At the end of six months, staff would provide the Parks and Recreation Commission and City Council with a status report.

If City Council approves the Parks and Recreation commission recommendation for the establishment of an off-leash dog area in the porposed location in Polliwog Park, staff will implement the project based on City Council direction.
