**SUBJECT:** Update on City Applications for Grant Funds and Federal Stimulus Money

---

**RECOMMENDATION:**

Staff recommends that the City Council receive and file this report on the City's efforts to obtain grants and American Reinvestment and Recovery Act (ARRA, or "stimulus") funds.

**FISCAL IMPLICATION:**

There are no fiscal implications associated with the recommended action. However, the receipt of grant funds allows us to construct projects, purchase equipment and provide services that may otherwise be funded by the General Fund or other existing sources, if at all.

In addition to the various grants the City has applied for and/or received, the City has applied for \$2,467,815 and has been awarded \$1,454,678 in stimulus (ARRA) funds.

**DISCUSSION:**

The City constantly seeks grant opportunities to fund programs, equipment and capital improvements. More recently, we have applied for stimulus funds for a number of projects and purposes, and have already been awarded funds. This report includes highlights of grants and stimulus funds that have been received as well as others for which applications are pending. It is presented by the general purpose of the funding.

**Transportation***Sepulveda Bridge Widening*

This project, which will add on extra lane to the Sepulveda bridge (just south of Rosecrans) to ease traffic constrictions has an estimated cost of \$17.3 million. So far, we have secured \$6.8 million through the Metropolitan Transportation Authority (MTA), and have applied for another \$11.5 million through the Congresswoman Harman and Senator Boxer's offices as part of the "Safe Accountable Flexible Efficient Transportation Equity Act - A Legacy for Users" (SAFETEA-LU) Act.

*Aviation Boulevard Resurfacing*

This stimulus funded project, which Council approved at the November 3, 2009 meeting, includes milling the existing asphalt roadway surface and construction of a new asphalt overlay on Aviation Blvd. from Marine Avenue to Manhattan Beach Blvd. The project also includes striping/traffic markings, traffic signal detection loops, and minor concrete construction. Since Aviation Boulevard has a functional classification as a major arterial street it is eligible for this federal funding. The total stimulus funds awarded for this project is \$364,000, while the estimated expenditures are \$216,475. The remaining balance (\$147,524) will be combined with the surplus stimulus funds from the Valley Drive project (described below) to possibly resurface Pacific Avenue from Manhattan Beach Blvd. to Rosecrans, pending MTA, CalTrans and City Council approval for this reallocation.

*Valley Drive Resurfacing*

Like Aviation, this stimulus funded project includes milling of the existing asphalt roadway surface and construction of a new asphalt overlay on Valley Drive from 15<sup>th</sup> Street to Sepulveda Blvd.. The project also includes full roadway reconstruction of significantly deteriorated areas, striping/traffic markings, traffic signal loops, and minor concrete construction. Since Valley Drive has a functional classification as a collector street it is eligible for federal funding. The total stimulus funds awarded for this project is \$710,000, while the estimated expenditures are \$566,188. The remaining balance (\$143,812) will be combined with the surplus stimulus funds from the Aviation Drive project (described above) to possibly resurface Pacific Avenue from Manhattan Beach Blvd. to Rosecrans, pending MTA, CalTrans and City Council approval for this reallocation.

*Rosecrans Avenue Widening*

This project will add one eastbound lane of traffic on Rosecrans from Redondo Avenue to the Manhattan Gateway shopping center, easing traffic flow. This project is pending utility easement negotiations with affected property owners. The total funds awarded for this project is \$1.75 million through the MTA.

*Strand Stairs*

While the Strand rehabilitation project was completed a few years ago, the stairs were not part of the scope of that project. This project will improve pedestrian walkways and stairs leading to the beach from the Strand. The City applied for SAFETEA-LU funds through Senator Boxer's office, and were awarded \$1.6 million for this project. The grant does require a 20% match from the City.

*Safe Routes to School*

Safe Routes to School, a CalTrans program, is designed to increase the number of children who walk or bicycle to school by funding projects that remove the barriers that currently prevent them from doing so. Those barriers include lack of or unsafe infrastructure, and lack of programs that promote walking and bicycling through education/encouragement programs. The City's grant, which totals \$735,930, will allow us to install florescent yellow school signs, high visibility crosswalks and markings, pedestrian signals near schools, and 80 countdown pedestrian signals.

**Energy & Environment**

*Energy Efficiency and Conservation Block Grant*

This grant, which is part of the federal stimulus funding, will be used to replace existing energy inefficient street lights with energy efficient induction lighting. The total grant is \$155,800, and the project will commence in the first quarter of 2010. The lighting will be for street lights, parking area lighting and security lighting.

**Law Enforcement & Public Safety**

*Ed Byrne Memorial Justice Assistance Formula Grant*

This grant, totaling \$24,878 in stimulus funds, will be used to purchase equipment and technology to enhance capabilities for investigators. The equipment will enhance DUI enforcement and traffic safety equipment needs, as well as officer safety equipment.

*Emergency Command Vehicle*

Through the generosity of the Manhattan Beach Property Owners' Association, the City has received a grant of \$203,609 for the purchase of an emergency command vehicle. This piece of equipment will allow us to operate a mobile command post for any emergency, including those involving Police, Fire or Public Works. Additionally, the Higgins Family Charitable Foundation has provided grant funding for \$26,500 in order to purchase emergency radios and a smart board for the command vehicle. We expect to take delivery of this in early 2010.

Other law enforcement grant opportunities we have applied for include funding for a dedicated IT staff person to assist and support the Police department with all department technology, equipment and network support needs (\$218,229); a shared grant with Gardena and Redondo Beach that would pay for a DNA criminalist to work out of the LA County Sheriff's crime lab for the benefit of Manhattan Beach, Gardena and Redondo Beach (\$330,302); funding for one police officer (for 3 years with a total cost of \$372,336); and grant funding to pay for overtime for narcotics investigations to assist in combating criminal narcotics in the City (\$92,270). These applications are pending approval and funding.

Attached for your information and review is a complete list of all grant funding currently being pursued or in progress. The attached grant schedule is inclusive of the ARRA grant funding described above.

Staff will continue to provide City Council with periodic updates on grant opportunities.
