SUBJECT: Introduction of New Employees, Employee Promotions and Service Awards;

Recognition of City Employee of the Year and Police Officer of the Year

RECOMMENDATION:

Staff recommends the following:

- 1) Introduction of new employees;
- 2) Recognize employee promotions;
- 3) Presentation of commemorative certificates and pins to employees who have completed 15 or more years of service to the City and
- 4) Recognition of City Employee of the Year and Police Officer of the Year.

FISCAL IMPLICATION:

There are no fiscal implications associated with the recommended actions.

BACKGROUND:

The City has a tradition of welcoming new employees by introducing them at Council meetings. This gives new employees an opportunity to meet the Council Members and Department Heads and experience firsthand how Council meetings are conducted at the City. This tradition includes recognizing promoted employees and presenting commemorative certificates and pins to long-term city employees.

The City also recognizes employees who have performed outstanding work and provided excellent service to the citizens of this community. The City's Employee Recognition Program selects the Employee of the Year among city employees who have been chosen as employees of the quarter during the year. For 2009, the Employees of the Quarter were: Ravy Sok, Information Systems Specialist, Jeff Goodrich, Police Officer, Julie Dahlgren, Management Analyst and Susie Myers, HR Technician.

The Police Officer of the Year is selected by the Police department's rewards and recognition committee.

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DISCUSSION: Police Department:

Employee Promotions

Joe Aiello was recently promoted to Police Sergeant. Sergeant Aiello began his law enforcement career in 1990 with the Montclair Police department while serving in the United States Air Force. Sergeant Aiello joined the United States Air Force at the age of 17 and served 11 years. Sergeant Aiello began his career with the Manhattan Beach Police department in February 2000. Since his service with the Manhattan Beach Police department, Sergeant Aiello has worked in patrol, juvenile detectives, fraud/forgery, and field training. Sergeant Aiello has a Bachelors of Science Degree in Business Management from the University of Phoenix.

Service Awards

Officer of the Year

<u>Sergeant Brian Brown</u> started his career with the City of Manhattan Beach as a Police Academy Trainee in 1997. He was promoted from Police Officer to Police Sergeant in 2004.

During 2009, Sergeant Brown has demonstrated distinguished service to the community of Manhattan Beach. One of the most notable events happened on Sunday, December 20, 2009. Sergeant Brown was working on an undercover surveillance detail and responded to a call of two young women caught in a rip tide who were possible drowning at the Pier. Prior to the Lifeguards arrival, Sergeant Brown borrowed a Boogie Board and entered the water in an effort to locate and assist them. He was able to locate the young women who were approximately 50 yards out in the water. After getting a hold of them he was able to bring them back to shore where they were met by LA County Lifeguards. Both women were injured while trying to hold onto the Pier pilings and were taken to the hospital for treatment. Lifeguard Captain Lee said Sergeant Brown's efforts likely saved the lives of these young women.

Sergeant Brown has also positively impacted the community through the enthusiasm, innovative vision, creativity and leadership he has brought to the Detective Bureau. Sergeant Brown has aggressively spearheaded and supervised numerous drug enforcement operations that have resulted in hundreds of thousands of dollars in cash, narcotics, numerous arrests and seizures of personal property. He has also implemented an on-line child predator investigation task force that works jointly with Los Angeles Police Department internet crimes against children unit. The narcotics unit continues to grow by leaps and bounds under his leadership.

Sergeant Brown has a Bachelor of Arts Degree in Sociology and Administrative Studies from the University of California Riverside and most recently earned a Masters of Arts Degree in Criminal Justice from Chapman University.

Fire Department:

James Muth was recently promoted to Fire Captain/Paramedic. Fire Captain Muth began his fire career in 1987 as a Fire Engineer/Paramedic with the Alhambra Fire Department. Then in 1992 he moved to Washington where he worked for Central Pierce Fire and Rescue. In 1997, Firefighter Muth moved back to Southern California and joined the Manhattan Beach Fire Department as a Firefighter/Paramedic. In 2002, he received a promotion to Fire Engineer/Paramedic. Fire Captain Muth was awarded Firefighter of the Year by the Fire Association in 2008. Fire Captain Muth is currently the Emergency Services Coordinator and will complete his Associates degree in the near future.
