SUBJECT: Introduction of New Employees, Employee Promotions, Service Awards and

Recognition of Firefighter of the Year

RECOMMENDATION:

Staff recommends that the City Council acknowledge the following:

Introduction of new employees; Recognition of employee promotions; Presentation of commemorative certificates and pins to employees who have completed 15 or more years of service to the City and Recognition of Firefighter of the Year.

BACKGROUND:

The City has a tradition of welcoming new employees by introducing them at Council meetings. This gives new employees an opportunity to meet the Council Members and Department Heads and experience firsthand how Council meetings are conducted at the City. This tradition includes recognizing promoted employees and presenting commemorative certificates and pins to long-term city employees.

The Firefighter of the Year is selected by the Manhattan Beach Firefighters' Association.

DISCUSSION:

Fire Department:

New Employees

<u>Craig Youngdale</u> is a new Firefighter/Paramedic with the Manhattan Beach Fire Department. Prior to joining the City of Manhattan Beach Fire Department he worked with Alexandria Fire Department located just outside of Washington D.C. While employed by Alexandria, he gained experience as an ER Paramedic, Flight Paramedic, and was a member of Marine Operations Team. Firefighter Youngdale has over 13 years in the Fire/EMS service.

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Employee Promotions

John Dulmage was recently promoted to Fire Engineer/Paramedic. Fire Engineer/Paramedic Dulmage began his fire career as a Certified Explorer with the Los Angeles County Fire Department in 1991 while pursuing certification to become a firefighter. In addition to fire fighting, Fire Engineer/Paramedic Wills has been a California Certified Nurseryman, Bartender, Flight Medic for Lifeflight of Southern California, a Pitcher for the Oakland A's and Angels organizations as well as a Mammoth Mountain Disabled Sports Ski Instructor.

He is currently in the final phase of obtaining his commercial jet aircraft pilot's certification so he can fly jets as a second career once he retires. He comes from a family of firefighters with his brother (Tom) serving as a Captain in the Anaheim Fire Department and his nephew (Travis) starting his career as a Firefighter/Paramedic for the Culver City Fire Department.
