SUMMARY STATEMENT: In accordance with WMC 5.08.120, on April 18, 2006, the City of Wasilla issued Request for Proposal 0620-0-2006/WM for Mission Hills Water Extension Project Engineering Services. This RFP was for engineering services which include engineering studies, surveying, construction plans, permitting, contractor coordination, etc. The actual construction project is proposed to begin in 2007.

Proposals were received from three firms: Enterprise Engineering, Michael L. Foster & Associates, and Lounsbury & Associates. Following a thorough review of the proposals to ensure each was responsive and responsible, a committee of three scorers (Director of Public Works, Deputy Director of Public Works, and Purchasing/Contract Officer) scored the proposals. Based upon firm experience, experience of the representative assigned to the City, methodology/approach, communication, proposed fee structure, and response from two references, Lounsbury & Associates, Inc., scored the highest

with 265 total points (see attached). Lounsbury & Associates, Inc., was the engineering firm for the Lucille Street Water & Sewer Extensions, the Crusey Street Water Main Extension and Third Party Sanitary Surveyor for the Spruce Avenue, Mission Hills, Lacey Lane and Bumpus Ballfiels public water systems.

SCOPE OF SERVICES: The City of Wasilla is soliciting proposals for engineering services for the Mission Hills subdivision water extension project. This project consists of extending the municipal water system with 12-inch ductile iron pipe to Mission Hills subdivision (see Attachment D). The installation will consist of approximately 3,000 feet of 12-inch DIP water main beginning on the west side of North Kimberly Street, crossing under Church Road and terminating near North Sam Snead Loop.

The successful proposer will provide the City with final design drawings and bid documents, coordinate with regulatory agencies for permits, assist the City in the bidding process, oversee construction, and provide record drawings with CAD files. This project is being performed under state and federal guidelines governing grants and loans.
