Bob Harris: Quality Auto (NAPA), Peking Restaurant and Pizza Hut connected to sewer and water. Contracts have been signed for the Glenwood and Naomi projects. The Naomi project starts tomorrow. The Neuser Drive paving problem is being completed and Glenwood will start next week. The City still has not signed a contract with Polarconsult. We have received a sample of the F&O insurance and will follow up.

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Mary Ellen Emmons; Ten sessions for pre-schoolers with volunteers have been completed. A volunteer has fixed the trim work, a leaking problem and a door handle. Wasilla Library has been selected for a visit by LSCA, Clarence Fogelstrom, reviewing library facilities in Alaska to help in determining funding needs.

John Cooper: The museum crew is working on the Teeland Building and getting ready for winter. The work in the basement is being completed. Slide projects on Old Wasilla are being prepared for the schools.

Mayor Stein: There are three major projects going on in Wasilla The Pizza Hut, Wasilla Business Park Mini Storage, and Quality Auto (NAPA). Last Thursday, Roger Magard of DOT, held a brief meeting regarding upcoming projects. Also, there will be an annual DOT planning meeting with the Borough regarding fundingfor trails, sidewalks, etc. There will be a meeting for WOW (Watch on Wasilla) at the Wasilla High School Little Theater at 7:00 PM regarding sales tax, police and mayor vs management form of government. Also there is a WP&UC meeting which includes a public hearing on a variance request by the Subway There are also public hearings on The Lucille Bike/Pedestrian Path and a public hearing on a street name change request. There was a serious dog bite on a three year old child by a German Shepherd. The City is working on having the dog declared a vicious dog. Key Bank volunteers will paint the hallways at Headstart this Thursday.
