5. **PUBLIC HEARING:**

A. Ordinance Serial No. 93-11; Amending Chapter 6.50, Sales Tax; CM. No. 93-13; CM No. 93-09

Mayor Stein opened the hearing to the public.

Bill Bruu; Homebuilders Association: Mr. Bruu stated the Homebuilders support the proposed ordinance, they have worked hard to simplify the process. The amendment reduces the administrative and audit work load for Wasilla.

Michael Slezak; Wasilla Area Seniors Inc. Director; Mr. Slezak stated that W.A.S.I. supports the proposed amendment to exempt professional operators of charitable games of chance from the sales tax requirements. Professional operators are often used by nonprofit groups because they have the equipment to easily operate the event. Mr. Slezak also indicated that they felt gaming players will play less if they are required to pay a sales tax every time they purchase a pull tab or redeem a winning pull tab. Mr. Slezak stated that state funding is being reduced and the Seniors cannot sustain any type of cut in any other source of revenue they have.

Minnie Fisher; Mat-Su Valley Humane Society President; Ms. Fisher supported exemption for gaming permits. Ms. Fisher stated that 40.1% of the Humane Society income comes from gaming, 40.2% from United Way and 9% from other sources.

<u>Laura Chase</u>; <u>Greater Wasilla Chamber of Commerce</u>; Ms. Chase stated that a 15% decrease in nonprofit group incomes will put that much more of a burden on the business people, organizations will go to the business people to make up their loss.

Bill Byers; A & B Tool & Equipment Rental; Mr. Byers stated he would like to see the amendment to 6.50.020 to include an exemption for equipment driven outside the City limits in a 7 mile radius.

<u>Leslie Bogda</u>; <u>Valley Womens Resource Center</u>; Ms. Bogda stated she supports the nonprofit gaming permit exemptions.

No further comments were made. Mayor Stein closed the hearing to the public.

B. <u>FY-94 Prebudget</u>

Mayor Stein opened the hearing to the public.

Mike Slezak; Mr. Slezak stated that the Senior Center water and septic treatment capacities are under rated and asked Council consideration of upgrading these items.

Mike Nelson, Sr. (via speaker phone); Mr. Nelson stated his concern with indications of no funding and stated it is not a lack of money but a lack of people with heart. Mr. Nelson asked the Community to act as a whole in putting programs and information together and that we all uphold the U.S. Constitution.

<u>Leslie Bogda</u>; <u>Valley Womens Resource Center</u>; Ms. Bogda stated that a large percentage of the women and children they have in their programs are in Wasilla or communities north and now with the police they may bring offices back into Wasilla. Ms. Bogda asked Council consideration of service agency grants from \$1,000 to \$5,000.

<u>Laura Chase</u>: Ms. Chase indicated that a number of organizations have economic development and without proper funding these projects cannot continue. Ms. Chase stated that the volunteers are already over expended and some funding is needed to help. Ms. Chase stated that the economic development is the future of Wasilla.

Bill Culbertson; Mr. Culbertson stated that many people are coming for funding and feels that a direct budget needs to be established prior to a division of funds.

Jim Palin: Mr. Palin stated that state funding is being reduced and it appears that the sales tax revenues will be more then originally projected. Mr. Palin cautioned Council to be careful of what monies are being spent on and suggested that now is the time for Council to develop a rainy day fund. Mr. Palin also asked Council to be very careful of economic development requests.

No other comments were made. Mayor Stein closed the hearing to the public.

6. PERSONS TO BE HEARD: (NON AGENDA ITEMS)

A. Eric & Barbara Poetzch;

Mrs. Poetzch stated that they were before Council on behalf of Old Matanuska Road. Mrs. Poetzch stated that in October 1991 the Council voted to accept maintenance for this road subject to upgrade. Mrs. Poetzch also indicated that the petitions circulated at that time was done by volunteers and the money used to send these petitions to the State and the Governor was hers and she was glad to have done it. Mrs. Poetzch asked Council to treat Old Matanuska Road and Church Road equally.

B. Jim Palin;

Mr. Palin spoke on the hiring policy of police and indicated that Wasilla needs to get the best qualified persons for the department. Mr. Palin also indicated that the City may need to offer a higher salary. Mr. Palin also commented on the Sewer Treatment Plant Project and indicated he hoped it was on schedule. Mr. Palin commented on the sales tax ordinance and it was difficult to treat all the people the same all the time and suggested Wasilla continue to follow Palmer's ordinance since theirs has been in effect for so long.

C. Ray McCarthy;

Mr. McCarthy passed a letter out to Council indicated that a citizen of Wasilla, Rose Palmquist, has been given the distinct honor of being selected to receive the "Denali Award" from the Alaskan of the Year Committee. Mr. McCarthy indicated that he has already bought tickets to the banquet and if Wasilla does not have someone representing Wasilla, he would be glad to represent the City.

Motion/Second: Carson/Carney

To suspend the rules and authorize Mr. McCarthy to represent Wasilla at the Banquet honoring Rose Palmquist with the "Denali Award". No objection, so ordered.
