Mrs. Stewart, Planning Commission Clerk: Reported on the Planning Commission meeting scheduled for tomorrow night.

Mrs. Emmons: Reported on the proposed State Library Budget cuts of 10% and cuts in federal aide to libraries and what this will do to programs for the blind and physically disabled.

Mr. Baugh: Reported that sales tax letters are going out now, and last Friday he and Judy went out and found 10 businesses operating without a business licenses.

Mr. Stambaugh: Reported that the testing and initial interview process has been completed and named the individuals on the committee who helped with this process and thanked them for their efforts.

Mr. Harris: Reported that Public Works is catching up on roads, they have completed spring cleaning at the sewer treatment plant. He has completed negotiations with one of the leaseholders at the airport, and reported on the bioremediation cleanup for the Old Wasilla Airport. Mr. Harris also stated that DOT has responded to lower speed limits and sight distance by Peck Street.

Mrs. Harris: Reminded Council to turn in their Conflict of Interest Statements, April 15th is the deadline.

Mr. Nelson: Reported that the Clerk's Office has received an application for referendum to repeal the sales tax ordinance.

Mayor Stein: Reported that Cleanup Days will be Saturday, May 1, 1993. BWIP Machine Shop has located to Wasilla. Mayor Stein stated that there is a small business loan for beautification which requires a match, not necessarily money. Does the Council with to pursue this or not. Council agreed that Administration should pursue this loan. Mayor Stein reported he should have the Parks Commission appointments at the next meeting, and he is working on organizing the Friends of Lake Lucille committee. He also stated that the budgets are in the Mayor's Office and the first budget worksession is scheduled for Monday, 04/19/93. Administration is working with the Alaska Railroad Corporation on the maintenance issue. Mapco is considering trucking fuel from the slope to Anchorage, this will mean a high volume of 2 and 3 tanker trucks passing through town on a daily basis. Mayor Stein also stated he has been speaking with Erling and Marj regarding splitting the

Clerk/Finance Director position, feels the workload warrants the split..
