Rand Gaynor: Valley resident, encourages adoption, vast economic benefit that will put Wasilla at the Heart of the Valley for winter recreation.

<u>Tom Marshall:</u> Voiced concerns about Wasilla becoming an avenue to the woods and his property is in the woods. Feels a need for more police to oversee the 2% of jerks out there.

Marilyn McGuire: Concerned about late night snow machiners, speed limits and access to Lake Lucille.

<u>John Minnick:</u> Encourages adoption and will do all that he can to help. Re-wrote ordinance 93-54 and offered it to Council.

<u>Dale Seuter:</u> Safety chairman for the Mat-Su Motor Mushers, encourages adoption, feels Wasilla will benifit positively.

Glenda Smith: Vice President of Alaska Snowmobile Association, feels Wasilla will benifit. She has been riding in Wasilla since 1988 with no repercussions.

<u>Bill Byers:</u> Offered 367 names (signatures) to the Council and a letter from Gary Weber stating that 30% of his business is winter related. Mr. Byers would like the freedom to ride.

<u>Dale Gardner:</u> opposes Ordinance 93-54 feels it is an open invitation for Anchorage residents to come have a cosmopolitan experience.

<u>Jim Holden:</u> Works with the Wasilla High School Ski team and invited all people to ski on their trails. Wants the safety of the children considered first.

<u>Kurt Schreiber:</u> Believes Ordinance 93-54 is an open invitation for Anchorage residents to come and raise hell. Are 3 and 4 wheelers legal too? Can the ordinance be enforced?

<u>Doug Sehm:</u> President of the Mat-Su Motor Mushers supports the idea of an accessible route through town.

<u>Pandora Willingham:</u> Supports ordinance, riding is a family activity and will use paths for access out of town.

<u>Kit Roberts:</u> Would like the freedom to be able to ride without having to load up his machine and go out of town.

Jim Tapscott: Concerned about the 2 percent of riders who do not obey the law and ride through his property.

<u>Larry Healy</u>: Concerned about the litter problem snow machiners might cause. Feels we need to worry about updating our road system.

Steve Smilove: Does not want snow machines on the bike paths and feels that by passing Ordinance 93-54 his property value will drop.

Micah Weinstein: Feels this can work successfully but there is a lot of work to be done.

<u>Bill Heairet:</u> Thinks most people will go to Big Lake and this is not really that big of a deal.

Ralph Winterrowd II: Stressed the importance of identification numbers on snow machines.
