Mayor Stein opened the hearing to the public. No comments were made. Mayor Stein closed the

hearing to the public.

Mayor Stein opened the hearing to the public.

<u>Steve Stoll:</u> Stated that the Railroad Depot needs work, ought to avoid City employee and City taking over the project. Feels the Lion's Club is doing a good job, suggested using tourist oriented ways with craft fairs to generate money for the poor through the Lion's Club. Mr. Stoll felt the Lion's Club should have a wide venue to operate.

Bruce Starborn-Jones: Felt the project should be tabled indefinitely, doesn't feel anything should be done until the City knows what will happen with the Parks Highway.

Jim Tapscott: Does not feel the rummage sale should be there to impair the dignity of the building.

Lynette Booth: Spoke about Job Focus 2000, they sponsor the home craft community. Ms. Booth stated they are currently looking for a location and hoped her director would be able to get to the meeting before the end to present a plan. Ms. Booth stated she did not want the railroad depot to become another museum.

<u>Hugh Johnson:</u> Spoke of the concern with the maintenance of the structure. Stated that the Planners have not looked into the site location and it might be best to not go with renovation right now, but to simply protect the building from becoming beyond repair.

<u>LeRoi Heaven:</u> Stated that building is on the National Register, does not feel the building does not need to be completely rebuilt but does need some fixing.

<u>Harold Newcomb:</u> Stated he is with the Lion's Club, they took over the railroad depot when the roof was leaking several years ago and saved the building by putting on a new roof and getting it placed on the National Register. Asked the City to at least maintain the building, don't allow further deterioration.

No further comments were made. Mayor Stein closed the hearing to the public.

Noel Kopperud: Stated that the properties on the peninsula have been developed for a number of years and is unhappy about a forced annexation. Mr. Kopperud suggested that the City's advantages should

speak for themselves and if the property owners want annexed, then the property owners should come forward with the annexation, not the City. Mr. Kopperud stated they are not receiving services from the City and suggested that these kind of issues should begin with the Planning Commission first.

<u>Bill Heairet:</u> Stated he has his own fire protection, the City Police did respond one time at Christmas, and one other time the City Police refused to respond. Don't force them into the City.

No further comments were made. Mayor Stein closed the hearing to the public.

Steve Stoll: Spoke of the Church Road intersection and its danger, felt that this should be part of the plan for Church Road and also the Alternative School location should also include a turn lane.

No further comments were made. Mayor Stein closed the hearing to the public.

Mayor Stein opened the hearing to the public.

Mike Chryst: Favors term limits, felt an incumbent should be able to make any contribution they are going to in two terms.

Mary Brasie: Felt its long past time for term limits.

<u>Sally Chryst:</u> Stated that Title 29 give people the right to vote on term limits, the Council took an oath to uphold the U.S. Constitution, the laws of the State and the laws of the City. Mrs. Chryst stated they just want the question placed on the ballot.

No further comments were made. Mayor Stein closed the hearing to the public.

G. Capital Move Financial Aid;

1. Ordinance Serial No. 94-39; Amending the FY-95 Budget by appropriating funds to the General Fund (financial aid in moving the capital)

Mayor Stein opened the hearing to the public.

<u>Pat Carney:</u> Chair of the Move It Committee. Mr. Carney spoke of his request a year ago for assistance and that in a recent poll, 55% support moving the capital. Mr. Carney also spoke of the fact that Juneau has put forward half a million dollars to keep the capital from moving. Mr. Carney stated they need funds for TV media and would like to see the Council pass this funding. He also stated he favors moving the capital because he feels it will provide better government for the whole of Alaska.

Mary Brasie: Favors moving the capital.

<u>Harold Newcomb</u>: Urged Council to move forward with passing Ordinance Serial No. 94-39. Mr. Newcomb spoke of many trips he has made to Juneau in the past and how full the planes were. The cost here is the cost of a few buildings and savings of all that travel.

Rose Palmquist: Stated she felt the businessmen should favor moving the capital, it would greatly increase their income. Ms. Palmquist stated to be effective with the State Legislature, you had to get close to home. Ms. Palmquist stated she felt the State could only gain by having the capital in a central place. The legislature can't hide with people watching over their shoulders. Ms. Palmquist stated that the City allocating this money is the best investment the City can make.

<u>Peter Bruchell:</u> Spoke of Pat Carney's efforts and commented this is building for the future and building an economic foundation.

<u>Steve Stoll:</u> Stated he is not arguing the merits of the capital move, but the City extorting money from sales tax is inappropriate use of the money. Mr. Stoll stated that the City needs to create the infrastructure for streets and many other projects.

<u>Jim Messick:</u> Urged favorable consideration by the Council of Ordinance Serial No. 94-39. Mr. Messick stated that Wasilla is the most central location, it has the space to grow. Mr. Messick also spoke of government agencies being located in Juneau and having State wide responsibility and the difficulty this created. Mr. Messick also stated that the bottom line is better government if its relocated to Wasilla.

<u>Don Ward:</u> Spoke of the initiative to have the capital moved several years ago. Mr. Ward stated he felt that this money being used for advertisement would only give the advertisers money. Mr. Ward then stated that through the efforts of 1 man in Juneau the capital was not moved in the past.

Mike Chryst: Stated he is opposed to spending a quarter of a million dollars of grocery money to move the capital, if Council and the Mayor won't get out and campaign then don't do it.

<u>Sally Chryst:</u> Stated the capital has been voted on before twice and feels the people will vote again without the quarter of a million dollars from the City of Wasilla, the problem is getting the capital moved after the vote. Mrs. Chryst asked the Council to please save the money.

Steve Adams: Stated that this was not his grocery money, but take some of his 2% and educate the people about the facts.

<u>Jean Kaye:</u> Stated she favors the 2%. Mrs. Kaye stated she and her husband don't have deep pockets, but they dug deep and came up with \$1,000.00 for the capital move and challenged anyone to match that.

<u>Jim Tapscott</u>: Stated he feels strong about the capital move and has been working behind the scenes. Mr. Tapscott stated that the first time this issue was voted on there was a slogan "Move the capital closer to the People". Mr. Tapscott stated he favors the capital move for the same reason.

Jim Palin: Stated he favors moving the legislature to the Southcentral area. He also stated he is not a large landowner and so will not profit from the land. Mr. Palin stated he is not in favor of the City spending this money. Mr. Palin stated that the City should be a partner, but not to foot the majority of the cost. Mr. Palin then spoke of the \$40 to \$42,000.00 spent last year on the petition drive and is not sure how that money was spent. Mr. Palin stated he has seen no budget and would like to see one.

Mr. Palin also stated he would like to see other communities contribute, the City is a small population carrying the burden of the State. Mr. Palin stated he favors moving the legislature in one form or another.

Ida Melane: Agreed with Mr. Palin, all the legislature should get behind.

Mary Brasie: Stated she is a senior citizen on a fixed income, but just gave a fair contribution to Mr. Carney and does not consider that grocery money.

<u>Pat Carney:</u> Stated that Deputy Mayor Hjellen is on the Move It Committee and is in a good position to see where the money is being used for advertising, its not going for wages.

<u>Bruce Starborn-Jones:</u> Stated that the capital should be moved, but more cities benefit from the move. Get them to kick in then go for it, but not until.

Jim Palin: Commented on the matching standpoint, suggested that the City propose matching \$1.00 for every \$10.00 donation.

No further comments were made. Mayor Stein closed the hearing to the public.

Mr. Johnson also stated that with the Pioneers Convention meeting in 1995 and the Garden Club Convention meeting in 1996 in Wasilla indicates positive steps forward.

Mayor Stein announced that there are a couple of vacancies on the Parks & Recreation Commission, one appointment for outside the City limits.

<u>LeRoi Heaven:</u> Reported on the progress being made on the Herning-Teelands-Mead Store over the last couple of week-ends through volunteer efforts.

E. <u>Wasilla Friends of the Library;</u>

<u>Jody Simpson:</u> Reported on the Summer Reading Program held at the Library, out of 1,013 participants, 542 finished the program. Ms. Simpson also reported on the Story Teller Project and the fund raiser on used book sales that the Wasilla Friends of the Library helped with, they raised \$2,000.00 in 1 week-end.
