PUBLIC HEARING:

A. <u>Senior Center Long Term Plan</u>; Public Testimony regarding a long term plan for the Floyd D. Smith Senior Center;

Mayor Stein opened the hearing to the public.

<u>Eleanor Baxter</u>: Ms. Baxter is a volunteer coordinator for the Senior Center and a representative for Semina asked for Council support.

<u>Jean Poole:</u> Stated that the Senior Center fills many voids that could occur in the city without the Center. For many Valley Seniors, the Center fills a social life, including hot meals, trips for shopping, etc. Seniors are helping in the schools, many volunteer hours go into the center and community. Ms Poole feels the relationship is good for the City and the Seniors and favors support.

<u>Tim Anderson</u>: Senior Center Director was available for questions. Mr. Anderson stated he hoped to receive \$25,000 annually. A plan for 35 units to be built with 10 units being utilized by middle income seniors is under consideration. The current units are being utilized by low income seniors. The 5 year plan for the Senior Center is based on a balanced budget and reflects normal inflation and normal cost increases, but is probably not reflected accurately.

<u>Steve Stoll:</u> Mr. Stoll stated that approximately 6 months ago, the City Council gave VPA the sum of \$180,000 without a question and yet, this group (Seniors) is proven and the Council grills them like criminals.

<u>Steve Stoll:</u> This issue was brought up earlier and the property owners were opposed at that time. If people in business are opposed then the city should not force them to be annexed into the City.

Mayor Stein: Read a letter from Kenai Supply President, William Wells into the record requesting information on how the City will benefit his business.

Joel Lynch: Mr. Lynch, Kenai Supply representative ask questions about plans for water and sewer service available to the property. Also, whether property taxes would increase or decrease.

Margaret Kopperud: Opposed the annexation, explaining there is no need for the City services.

Bill Harret: Explained that he doesn't receive the services and opposes the annexation.

Mayor Stein: Introduced into the record a letter from Jack Harris Trust opposing the annexation.

<u>Leonard Michel's:</u> Resents being called a freeloader. Stated that the cost will be considerably more if the annexation is forced, just as in other instances.

<u>Erling Nelson:</u> A City representative, having been the City Clerk at the time the Cottonwood Mall was annexed, appeared before the Local Boundary Commission as a City representative. At that time there was no Police Department. He felt an obligation to ask questions when the Police Department became an issue. Finance Department feels Council has a duty to keep the playing field even for all merchants. Is in favor of annexing the parcels.

No other comments were made. Mayor Stein closed the hearing to the public.

John Cannon: Planning Commissioner stated there were no significant action items at the January 24th meeting. The Mainstream USA meeting in Soldotna went extremely well, making the trip very worthwhile. Mr. Cannon thanked the Council for the opportunity of attending.

- B. <u>Jim Page:</u> A forester by profession, was made aware of funds being available for Rural Communities. Since Wasilla is classified as a Rural Community, Mr. Page wanted to share his knowledge. There are opportunities for people who are involved in wood products to use these funds. He will inform Council as to the availability and progress in this program.
- C. <u>Steve Stoll:</u> Mr. Stoll passed out a packets from Reason Magazine referencing the DARE program stating that it does not work in keeping kids off drugs but does build repoir between police and kids. Also, it takes police off the streets. Nelson Ave has a 2 inch wide crack and is only 2 years old. Mr. Stoll would like to see the paving done in a proper manner. Objects to the method used in getting the projects out to the engineering firms. Three firms, Alaska Rim, Denali North and Gilfilian has total control with no scrutiny. One firm did a project and did not include culverts in the project. Mr. Stoll ask that the City look at projects more closely when considering a project.

<u>John Cooper:</u> reported that the Mat-Su Homebuilders Association is again working on Teelands building. Microfilming is going well and thanked the Council for having faith in the Historical Land transfer (Teelands Site).

<u>Dean Baugh:</u> reported on the budget for the Finance Department and the Airport billing being done in that department.

<u>Duane Dvorak:</u> spoke about the delegation of authority and issuance of permits starting on the 27th of February. Major development permit for public hearing on the Wasilla Middle School addition is scheduled before the Planning Commission tomorrow night. February 14, 1995.

Mayor Stein: talked about the Iditarod Re-Start being on Sunday March 5th. The railroad is bringing 6-7 coaches full of people. Ask the City to schedule motorcoaches for the transportation from the depot to the re-start area. Chugiak Children's Services agreement expires on 05/31/95. The City needs to make a decision as to use for that space as it brings in revenue of approximately \$18,000 annually. Mayor Stein spoke about the planning process meetings which took place at the Mainstreet USA meeting in Soldotna.
