10. NEW BUSINESS:

A. General Liability Insurance;

Steve Wells and Jay Millard represented AML/JIA. Combs Insurance was represented by Mike Combs, Ken Rudolph and Leo Bettoni.

Mr. Mike Combs referred to the bid proposals which were opened on 5/15/96. By his analysis the CIGNA program was superior as well as being approximately \$21,000 less money. Mr. Combs erenced page 2 where it shows the City as having an equity of \$80,000, but AML/JIA does not show were it is balanced out and payable.

Mr. Steve Wells expressed the fact that the Finance Pools are designed for long range and can ride the industries different cycles which go from hard and soft. Mr. Wells feels that their coverage is much better than anyone else indicating they are the leaders in this field.

Motion/Second; Palin/Hartrick

To continue coverage with AML/JIA. Motion passed with Mr. Chappel and Mr. Carney in opposition. Ms. Hjellen, Mr. Hartrick, Mr. Lockwood and Mrs. Palin in favor, with Mayor Stein abstaining because his being an officer of AML/JIA.

B. <u>Health Insurance</u>;

<u>David Frazier</u>; reported on the health insurance package he received from the proposals that were sent out. He has received 6 responses as of this date. With a 31% increase in premiums Blue Cross is still very competitive. The Preferred Provider program would consist of Valley Hospital and Providence Hospital with Alaska Regional to provide only certain procedures not provided by Providence. All fees would actually be about the same cost to the City with the Preferred Provider Program. Self insurance is not cost effective until there are approximately 100 employees. Mr. Frazier talked about the possibilities of self funding Dental and Visual because Blue Cross will write on package basis only, which will be looked into.

C. <u>Animal Control;</u>

s. Hjellen was concerned there would be problems if the City turned over any power at the Borough level. The existing contract was discussed and Administration was directed to establish a balance of contract for services.

<u>Dick Deuser</u>: Stated that the Peck Street condemnation matter has gone very poorly, Kopperud who was named by the Court to state a value came back with a value in excess of \$20,000. The matter will soon be over.

<u>Chief Stambaugh:</u> June 4th the Police Department personnel went on 12 hour shifts because of the Miller's Reach Fire. This morning June 10th all officers were back on their regular schedule except the school officer.

Mr. Cooper: Reported that the Alpar and JTPA programs are gearing up for the season. Tuesday the Parks crews worked with the Historical Society to move Knik Museum into the old school house. They will also take care of the not so small places in the playground. Make them smaller to prevent children from being stuck again.

<u>Duane Dvorak</u>: said the planning department has accepted 47 permit applications. Creekside Property file has been turned over to the City Attorney as a test case.

Marjorie Harris: Ask Council to bring in their Code books soon, as there will be the normal 6 month update coming out. Informed the Council that the Clerk's Office will be open from 8:00 a.m. till 7:00 n. during absentee balloting for all three elections this fall.

1ayor Stein: Spoke about the fire and the KIMO (channel 13) upcoming meeting sponsoring a telethon aising relief funds for the fire victims.
