Mayor Stein opened the hearing to the public.

<u>Barbara Poetzsch</u> stated that she had taken a grass poll of the property owners from Richmond Hills and Richmond View Subdivisions and that most of them have no problems with the zoning. However, the group would like to have a list of types of businesses included in a neighborhood setting. To define uses and not just use the blanket theory. There should be guidelines before unacceptable businesses are brought into the neighborhood. Mrs. Poetzsch also mentioned that there may not be enough notification on the public hearings.

<u>Eric Poetzsch</u> ask if the zoning will affect the covenants for the property. Mayor Stein explained that zoning would not affect them and that the covenants are still enforceable by the property owners.

<u>Duane Dvorak</u> City Planner came forward and handed maps to each Council member explaining that the official map was hanging on the wall in the Council Chambers by the doors. He also provided a survey of changes and clarifications of problems in the past. Use by right development is important as it impacts special criteria with little latitude for conditions. Neighborhoods adopt neighborhood plan is nsistent with the City's overall plan. The Planning Commission recommends to the City Council there another public hearing on the 22nd of July, 1996. Mr. Dvorak introduced Mr. Gordon Lewis, Planning Consultant.

Gordon Lewis expressed the importance of the entire Code and stated that the map is an important part of the Code. By revising the Code, it is about one third as large as it was to begin with. Mr. Lewis answered concerns and questions from the audience and Council. The need to read the description about Group Homes and that the covenants run with the land, the City has no ownership of them and will not enforce the covenants. The property owners must enforce the covenants or the covenants will go away. He also pointed out any changes made to the Code, must be carefully considered, as it may change the Code in other sections.

<u>Colleen Cottle</u> spoke of the map showing some of the streets on West Lakeview as parks and asked if the City has come up with a new designation. Mayor Stein said they had not. Mrs. Cottle indicated that the Code is too liberal and it should be as strong as the Mat-Su Boro Code. Asked if there was something going on in the wings and stated that the City needs to think about it's residents.

<u>Steve Glos</u> supports the Code and stated that the Neighborhood Plan is very advantageous in that you can plan your own neighborhood.

There being no further comments, Mayor Stein extended the public hearing into recess until July 22, 96.

B. <u>Ordinance Serial No. 96-28;</u> Animal Control. Mayor Stein opened the hearing to the public.

<u>_arbara Poetzsch</u> stated there are too many stray dogs in their neighborhood, Upon calling the animal control she was informed that for \$50.00 she could come get a trap and trap the animals herself, that animal control doesn't have the funds or man power to deal with the problem.

<u>Scott Sterling</u> stated that the Borough Ordinance is great, the funding is the problem. Votes are not there to fund the animal control and funds are needed for enforcement. Mr. Sterling stipulated that in his opinion the Council is doing the right thing in this Ordinance.

<u>Jim White</u> introduced himself as the "dog vigilante", stated that with what he has been through with the Borough, if you want animal control it will cost the taxpayers money.

<u>Dick Deuser</u> City Attorney stated the best way to copy the Ordinance of the Borough would be to get a disc and manually change the wording where it would be appropriate. Which would avoid any confusion, and suggested that the public hearing be continued until July 22, 1996.

There was no objection to Mayor Stein continuing the hearing until July 22, 1996.
