Anne Kilkenny: Ms. Kilkenny suggested that just because Anchorage does their mail outs in a 600 foot radius, does not mean that Wasilla has to do their mail outs in the same way. Ms. Kilkenny also indicated that if a mail out were done right the first time, money would be saved. Ms. Kilkenny indicated she did not think it was appropriate to do Wasilla's mail outs the way Anchorage does theirs.

A. Curtis Philbin; Taxicab Company Regulations

Mr. Philbin provided material to Council on taxicab insurance and indicated that he feels the new insurance requirements are unreasonable and that insurance companies currently don't have the coverage that Wasilla is requiring. Mr. Philbin requested that Council reconsider and re-instate the old requirements which made a lot more sense.

B. Anne Kilkenny; Century Park Paving LID

Ms. Kilkenny spoke of the Century Park paving LID and spoke of the terrific job done by the Wilder crew, but indicated concerns over the temperature when the pavement was placed on frozen ground, the surveying error made resulting in deeper ditches and that 2 2/3 of the culverts and nearly 30 driveway aprons do not meet city code. Ms. Kilkenny urged Council and Mayor Palin to strengthen the public works department before the \$5.5 million bonding package comes on line with the new paving projects.

C. <u>Larry & Ellen Sullins</u>; Century park Paving LID

Mr. Sullins is a resident of Century Park and stated that there is a problem with pavement encroaching onto his property which wiped out a screening strip. Drainage is a problem in a certain parts of the subdivision. He presented pictures of the problems addressed, and stated that he hopes this issue does not end up in litigation, however, he will do what ever is necessary. He thanked the City for the sewer system.

No other persons were heard.
