SUMMARY:

THE STATE OF ALASKA, DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH AND SOCIAL SERVICES IS CONSIDERING TO LOCATE A MAT-SU YOUTH DETENTION FACILITY IN THE WASILLA AREA. LOCATING THIS FACILITY IN THE WASILLA AREA HAS THE FOLLOWING BENEFITS:

- The Matanuska-Susitna Borough School District's Alternative High School is located near the Parks Highway and Church Road. The Alternative High School will be used for training those detained in this facility.
- The construction of a 4.5 to 5 million dollar facility will be an economic benefit during the construction of such a facility.
- The annual operational cost between 1 and 1.6 million dollars will support the economic benefit for employment, and many support services such a laundry, janitorial, food preparation and delivery, etc.
- The close proximity to the proposed Public Safety Facility would be an economical and time saving benefit for reducing travel time of a Wasilla Police juvenile transport.
- The McLaughlin Youth Center is overcrowded and 20% of their population is from our area.
- This facility would allow many juveniles to be closer to their families that live in the Greater Wasilla area.
- The New Wasilla Airport property is zoned I-Industrial and supports the development of a correctional facility.
- The potential exists of increasing revenue from the Wasilla Airport by leasing available land to the State of Alaska.
- The Alaska State Troopers periodically transport juveniles with State of Alaska aircraft.
- The Alaska State Troopers frequently transport juveniles via the Parks Highway.



A resolution has been drafted and will be forwarded to the Wasilla Planning Commission (WPC). The result of the meeting of the WPC will be forwarded to the Wasilla City Council.
