RESOLUTION NO. WR94-75

A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY OF WASILLA, ALASKA OPPOSING UNFUNDED FEDERAL MANDATES AND CALLING UPON PRESIDENT CLINTON AND THE CONGRESS OF THE UNITED STATES TO REFRAIN FROM PASSING SUCH MANDATES WITHOUT ADEQUATE FUNDING IN THE FUTURE.

WHEREAS, unfunded federal mandates on state and local governments have increased significantly in recent years; and

WHEREAS, three-quarters of the mandates imposed on local governments by Congress have been imposed in the last twenty years, often with the promise of financial support for the costs of compliance; and

WHEREAS, federal mandates require local governments to perform duties without consideration of local circumstances or capacity; and

WHEREAS, federal mandates require compliance regardless of other pressing local needs and priorities affecting the health, welfare, and safety of municipal citizens; and

WHEREAS, excessive federal burdens on local governments force some combination of higher local taxes and fees or reduce local services to citizens and local taxpayers; and

WHEREAS, federal mandates are too often inflexible, "one-size-fits-all" requirements that impose unrealistic time frames and specify procedures or facilities when less costly alternatives might be just as effective; and

WHEREAS, the inflexibility of federal mandates, lack of applicability to local situations, and excessive cost are particular problems in Alaska; and

WHEREAS, existing mandates impose harsh pressures on local budgets and the federal government has imposed a freeze upon funding to help compensate for any new mandates; and

WHEREAS, the effect of statutory mandates is often worsened by regulations, administrative rules and court decisions; and

WHEREAS, the cumulative effect of these legislative and regulatory actions has a direct negative impact on the citizens of Alaska's municipalities; and

WHEREAS, the Alaska Municipal League, National League of Cities, National Association of Countries, International City/County Management Association, and other groups of state and local government representatives have begun a national public education campaign to help citizens understand and then reduce the burden and inflexibility of unfunded mandates; and

WHEREAS, some Congressional leaders are beginning to understand the burden placed on local governments by unfunded federal mandates, but no legislation has yet passed to limit such mandates;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the City of Wasilla urges President Clinton, the congress of the United States, and the judiciary to declare and honor a halt to further mandates, whether by statue, judicial fiat, or administrative regulation; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the City of Wasilla shall work with members of the Alaskan Congressional delegation to inform them about the impact of federal mandates and actions necessary to reduce their burden on Alaskan citizens; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the City of Wasilla urges each municipal official to help inform the public as well as state and federal elected and appointed officials about the burden placed on Alaskan local governments by unfunded federal mandates.
