ORDINANCE SERIAL NO. 92-39

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF WASILLA, ALASKA ESTABLISHING A POLICE DEPARTMENT.

BE IT ORDAINED AND ENACTED BY THE CITY OF WASILLA, ALASKA AS FOLLOWS:

<u>SECTION I.</u> <u>Classification.</u> This ordinance is of a general and permanent nature and shall become a part of the Wasilla Municipal Code.

<u>SECTION II.</u> <u>Purpose.</u> To establish a Wasilla Police Department.

SECTION III. Creation. There shall be a police department as authorized by WMC 1.08.050(G).

<u>SECTION IV.</u> <u>Mission.</u> The police department shall be responsible for the preservation of public peace and order, the prevention and detection of crime and apprehension of offenders of the law, the protection of persons and property, the enforcement of the law, and other duties for the general public welfare as may from time to time be assigned.

<u>SECTION V.</u> <u>Appointment of Chief.</u> The department head will be the Chief of Police who shall be appointed by the Mayor/Manager pursuant to Title 3, Personnel System.

<u>SECTION VI.</u> <u>Duties of Chief.</u> The duties of the Chief shall be to develop for Council adoption the necessary ordinances and budget to govern and operate the police department and to assemble the personnel, facilities, equipment and supplies necessary to field a police force. The Chief shall rely on the Draft Wasilla Police Department Conceptual Design and subsequent guidance from City ordinances and the Mayor/Manager to develop the department. The Chief shall manage the department.

<u>SECTION VII.</u> <u>Effective Date.</u> This ordinance becomes effective upon adoption by the Wasilla City Council.
