AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF WASILLA AMENDING CHAPTER 1.24 GENERAL PENALTIES OF THE WASILLA MUNICIPAL CODE.

BE IT ORDAINED AND ENACTED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF WASILLA, ALASKA AS FOLLOWS:

<u>SECTION I.</u> <u>Classification.</u> This ordinance is of a general and permanent nature and shall become a part of the City Code.

<u>SECTION II.</u> <u>Purpose.</u> The purpose of this ordinance is to amend Chapter 1.24 of the Wasilla Municipal Code to provide for penalties for a revised City animal control ordinance.

SECTION III. Amendment. Section 1.24.010 General Penalty is amended to read as follows:

- A. A person who violates any ordinance of the City of Wasilla is guilty of a misdemeanor and upon conviction is punishable by a fine of not more than two hundred dollars. All penalty codes conflicting with the provisions of this section, provided for herein, are hereby repealed except as expressly pvided for in Subsection B below.
- B. The general penalty provided in Subsection A above is not applicable to violations of WMC 12.04 WMC 12.05 Animal Control which shall be subject to the penalty provisions set forth in Section 1.24.030 Section 12.05.600 through Section 12.05.650; Subsection A, above, is also not applicable to violations of WMC 14.01 Wasilla Traffic Code. The penalties for such Wasilla Traffic Code are set forth by the terms of WMC 14.01 et. seq. All penalty codes conflicting with the provisions of Subsection A; provided for herein, are hereby repealed.
- C. Section 1.24.030 is hereby repealed in its entirety.

<u>SECTION IV.</u> <u>Effective Date.</u> This ordinance becomes effective upon adoption by the Wasilla City Council.
