AN ORDINANCE OF THE WASILLA CITY COUNCIL AMENDING WMC 2.16.060, DEPUTY MAYOR IN RELATION TO DELEGATION OF AUTHORITY DURING THE MAYOR'S TEMPORARY ABSENCE OR DISABILITY.

- * Section 1. Classification. This ordinance is of a general and permanent nature and shall become part of the city code.
- * Section 2. Amendment of section. WMC 2.16.060, Deputy mayor, is amended to read as follows:
- 2.16.060 Temporary absence or disability [DEPUTY MAYOR].

The mayor shall designate a council member [TO ACT] as [THE] deputy mayor to preside at council meetings during the mayor's temporary absence or disability. The mayor, subject to council approval, shall designate a city employee, or series of city employees in order of succession, to perform the executive and administrative functions of the mayor during the mayor's temporary absense or disability [IN THE MAYOR'S ABSENCE, THE DEPUTY MAYOR SHALL PRESIDE AT COUNCIL MEETINGS AND PERFORM THE DUTIES ASSIGNED BY THE MAYOR. THE DEPUTY MAYOR SHALL BE GRANTED NO POWER OR AUTHORITY NOT GRANTED AS A COUNCIL MEMBER].

* Section 3. Effective date. This ordinance shall take effect upon adoption of the Wasilla City Council.

Line of Succession to Mayor in an Emergency

Dear Mayor Keller:

The following responds to your request for advice on the procedure for the City of Wasilla (the "City") to designate persons to act in the capacity of Mayor upon the death, disability or absence of the Mayor in a time of emergency. State law provides the methods for selection of a successor if the office of Mayor is vacated by death or permanent disability. However, state law does not clearly provide for the selection of a person to act in the place of Mayor during the Mayor's temporary absence or disability. We suggest an ordinance revision to clearly provide for the selection of a person to act in the place of the Mayor during the Mayor's temporary absence or disability.

The council, by two-thirds concurring vote, shall declare the office of mayor vacant upon the occurrence of certain events, including when the Mayor "is physically or mentally unable to perform the duties of office." If a vacancy in the office of mayor occurs no more than six months before a regular election, the council appoints a person to serve until the regular election, when a successor is elected for the unexpired term. If a vacancy in the office of mayor occurs more than six months before a regular election, the council shall call a special election to fill the office for the unexpired term.
