SUMMARY STATEMENT:

The Police Department has 19 commissioned personnel and has replaced 2 vehicles each year for the past several years. The life expectancy for a pursuit class patrol vehicle has been approximately 5 - 6 years. With our current staffing we occasionally need to purchase an additional vehicle to maintain a mechanically safe and reliable fleet.
