* **Section 3. Appropriation.** Funds are appropriated to the following fund:



SUMMARY STATEMENT:

The transfer of \$5,000 from the Police building CIP to a general fund account is needed to complete a technology grant project that will install closed-circuit television monitors and intercoms in the police building. This will allow WPD dispatch to monitor exterior front and back door access and activity and to monitor the Data Master for officers conducting breath alcohol testing and/or dispatch access. The technology grant has approximately \$3,000.00 remaining for this project and will be combined with general funds to accomplish the project.
