Section 3 Appropriation. Funds are appropriated to the following:



SUMMARY STATEMENT: The Museum has applied for and received an Institute of Museum and Library Services grant for the purpose of conducting a Public Dimension Assessment through the Museum Assessment Program.

The Museum Assessment Program (MAP) is funded by the Institute of Museum and Library Services (IMLS) and administered by the American Association of Museums, a not-for-profit, national museum service organization. MAP is designed to help museums assess their strengths and weaknesses, and to plan for the future. Map is a tool for museums to use as part of an ongoing cycle of strategic planning and performance evaluation.

The Public Dimension Assessment supports an evaluation of the way in which the museum serves and collaborates with its community and audiences and how it communicates with its public.
