

SUMMARY STATEMENT: The Library received the Staying Connected grant from the Alaska State Library and the Bill & Melinda Gates Foundation. The monies will be used to replace patron word processing computer. Currently, we only have one computer that has word processing software on it. This computer is used by our patrons to write reports for school, create resumes, produce flyers for home-based businesses and compose letters to loved ones. Our current word processing computer does not have a working CD-ROM drive or easily accessible USB ports, which are two features that are increasingly being requested. Additionally, the new patron computer will be connected to the Internet (our current one is not) so that patrons who wish to create a resume and email it to prospective employers or write a paper to send to their distance learning class via the Internet will be able to do so from the same computer. This will be a welcome change and benefit to our library patrons. Our current Internet computers do not have word processing capabilities.
