RESOLUTION NO. WR97-45

A RESOLUTION OF THE WASILLA CITY COUNCIL RECOMMENDING PRIORITIES TO THE MATANUSKA-SUSITNA BOROUGH FOR INCLUSION IN THE MATANUSKA-SUSITNA BOROUGH'S SIX (6) YEAR CAPITAL IMPROVEMENT PROGRAM (CIP), FY1999 - 2004.

WHEREAS, the City of Wasilla represents a community of more than 4,917 people who are also citizens of the Mat-Su Borough; and

WHEREAS, the Mat-Su Borough provides for many important roads, services and public facilities serving the Greater Wasilla community, either directly or through service areas and contracts for construction and maintenance; and

WHEREAS, the City of Wasilla is also served by the State of Alaska which maintains highways, roads and other public facilities including the Parks Highway, Knik-Goose Bay Road, Palmer-Wasilla Highway, Main Street/Wasilla-Fishhook Road, Crusey Street, Church Road, Old Matanuska Road, Lucus Road and the Wasilla Airport; and

WHEREAS, the State of Alaska administers the federal airport improvement program for the Wasilla Airport; and

WHEREAS, the Wasilla City Council wishes to endorse community priorities for needed Borough and State capital improvement projects in the greater Wasilla area, particularly highways, roads and public facilities; and

WHEREAS, the comments of the MSB six year plan should be provided to the MSB no later than November 15, 1997;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Wasilla City Council hereby establishes the projects identified in Attachment "A", for inclusion in the Matanuska-Susitna Borough's six (6) year Capital Improvement Program (CIP), FY1999- 2004, and adopted here by reference.

I certify that a resolution in substantially the above form was passed by a majority of those voting at a duly called and conducted meeting of the Planning Commission of the City of Wasilla this 27th day of October, 1997.

TRANSPORTATION IMPROVEMENT PROGRAM

NATIONAL HIGHWAY SYSTEM

- 1. Parks Highway Improvement, in order of importance:
 - A. Palmer Wasilla Highway Extension to Knik Goose Bay Road
 - B. Seward Meridian to Crusey
 - C. Interchanges at Seward Meridan and Hyer Road
 - D. Crusey Street to Lucus Road
 - E. Church Street to Seward Meridian
 - F. Glenn Highway to Church Street

SURFACE TRANSPORTATION PROGRAM

1. Church Road Upgrade

Reconstruct and pave. Request to modify to include a traffic light at Church Road and Parks Highway. Please see Wasilla City Council Resolution WR97-43 as attached.

Church Road (South)

From Parks Highway South to Greater Wasilla Airport. Currently has a priority rating of a number four according to the Alaska Department of Transportation and Public Facilities (DOTPF) 1997 needs list. Please see letter dated October 15, 1997 from Mayor Sarah H. Palin to John Horn, DOTPF Regional Director.

3. Spruce Avenue

Upgrade and Pave: Currently has a priority rating of a number four according to the DOTPF 1997 needs list. Please see letter dated October 15, 1997 from Mayor Sarah H. Palin to John Horn, DOTPF Regional Planner. Would like this project included in the MSB Road Upgrade/Paving Matching Grant Program (Dust Control). Recommend that State funds also be solicited. The City of Wasilla will provide a major portion of the construction cost because the bond sale passed supporting the paving of this road.

4. Seward Meridian Boulevard Upgrade

Widen to four lanes from Parks Highway to Bogard Road.

5. Lucille Street to Susitna/Park Avenue Skyline Overpass

This is a modification of Wasilla-Fishhook Road/Main Street/Knik Goose Bay Road that was a City of Wasilla priority three last year. A new location is under consideration and additional facts are brought forth. The new nomination form is attached. Lucille Street makes more sense to extend because it is already a minor collector and connecting it to Susitna or Park Avenue could lead to producive east-west traffic directing traffic towards the future Palmer-Wasilla Highway overpass. Trails and Pedestrian crossings should be considered in the overpass as this would allow foot traffic to be directed to and from the Old Airport Site Park and the residents and tourists could enjoy the scenic Lake Lucille. Pedestrian overpasses have been requested in the past MSB six year plan. These could be combined with the Lucille Street vehicle overpass.

Mack Road Extension North to Church Road

Knik-Goose Bay to Parks Highway Interconnect.

Widen and upgrade Mack Road.

Reference resolutions passed by Wasilla City Council, Wasilla Planning Commision, and Wasilla Chamber of Commerce in support of Mack Road.

7. Wasilla-Fishhook Road Upgrade

Reconstruct and repave from Knik-Goose Bay Road to Shrock Road.

8. Old Matanuska Road Upgrade

Reconstruct and pave.

9. Thomas Street Extension South to Togiak

Fairview Loop to Glenwood Interconnect.

10. Seldon Road

Upgrade and pave from Lucille Street to Wasilla-Fishhook Road.

11. Seward Meridian Boulevard Extension

From Bogard Road to Seldon Avenue extension.

12. Vine Road Upgrade

Pave from Knik-Goose Bay Road to Hollywood Boulevard.

13. Hollywood Boulevard Upgrade

Pave from Vine Road to Big Lake waste transfer station

BRIDGE REHABILITATION/REPLACEMENT PROGRAM

1. Old Matanuska Road

Widen and reconstruct bridge over Cottonwood Creek (located near the junction of Old Mat Road and unconstructed portion of Rainier Drive, just South of Palmer-Wasilla Highway and Parks Highway Intersection).

SAFETY PROGRAM

1. Wasilla - Fishhook/Main Street/Nelson Avenue/Bogard Road

Intersection reconstruction and upgrade. Traffic is likely to increase from Bogard Road through Nelson Avenue. A lot of foot traffic is near Lucille and Nelson due to the high amount of residential-type occupancies and location at the Old Airport Site Park. A traffic light is warranted at Lucille and Nelson.

2. Bogard Road/Crusey Street

Intersection reconstruction and upgrade

- 3. Palmer-Wasilla Highway/Parks Highway Intersection
- 4. Knik-Goose Bay/Glennwood Signalization

This intersection signalization currently has a priority rating of a number four according to the DOTPF 1997 needs list. Please see Wasilla City Council Resolution WR97-43 as attached.

TRANSPORTATION ENHANCEMENTS

- 1. City of Wasilla Pedestrian/Bike/Multi-Use Paths
 Improvements to allow motorized (ATV, snowmachine) use.
- 2. Rail with Trail, Trail from Chugiak to Palmer and Wasilla
- 3. Parks Highway Seperated Path Around Schools/Communities on all Highway Upgrades
 Pedestrian overpasses have been nominated in the past. Please note that an additional pedestrian overpass could be combined with the Lucille Street to Susitna Avenue Skyline Overpass as stated above in the surface transportation program.

1. Wasilla Airport

3. Wasilla Airport

Extension of airport runway length.

4. Wasilla Airport

FAA - Lake access ramp and taxiway.

5. Wasilla Airport

FAA - Construct parallel runway.

6. Wasilla Airport

FAA - Global positioning locator system.

7. Wasilla Airport

Install non directional beacon.
