RESOLUTION SERIAL NO. 99-36**

A RESOLUTION OF THE WASILLA CITY COUNCIL ACCEPTING OWNERSHIP AND/OR OPERATION AND MAINTENANCE OF THE STATE OF ALASKA DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION AND PUBLIC FACILITIES' STORM WATER COLLECTION SYSTEM LOCATED WITHIN CITY LIMITS.

WHEREAS, to protect and to enhance the water quality of Wasilla Lake, Lake Lucille, and Cottonwood Creek and to protect ground water resources used for the City of Wasilla's Water Utility and for privately owned drinking water wells within city limits; and

WHEREAS, proper storm water collection, treatment, and disposal will enhance protection of water resources; and

WHEREAS, to correct existing city street flooding problems; and

WHEREAS, the City of Wasilla requests that the State of Alaska, through the Department of Transportation and Public Facilities, transfer ownership and/or operations of the State storm water collection system within the City of Wasilla limits; and


WHEREAS, the City of Wasilla will accept the State of Alaska storm water system for ownership and/or operations and maintenance provided that the State of Alaska will:

1. Install storm water collection lines in conjunction with State and National Highway System road projects in Wasilla and connect with the City's proposed storm water pumping and treatment facility; and
2. Award additional points for the Church Road South project in recognition of the City reducing Department of Transportation and Public Facilities operating and maintenance costs on other facilities.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the Wasilla City Council authorizes the Administration to enter an agreement consistent with the above items.

ADOPTED by the Wasilla City Council on October 25, 1999.
