WHEREAS, the Borough and City while working with the public has found substantial support from organizations like the Greater Wasilla Chamber of Commerce, Big Lake Chamber of Commerce, Greater Palmer Chamber of Commerce, Houston Chamber of Commerce, and Willow Chamber of Commerce for development of multiple-use trails in the core areas of Palmer and Wasilla and throughout the Matanuska-Susitna Borough; and

WHEREAS, the Matanuska-Susitna Borough has adopted a trails plan that identifies existing recreational trails outside of the borough's core area; and

WHEREAS, the Borough and City recognize that a Wasilla to Big Lake trail is the key "link" to create an integrated trail network from the borough's core area to Denali National Park, Alaska's number one visitor attraction; and

WHEREAS, the Wasilla City Council passed Resolution Serial No. 00-09 which proposes to provide ownership and maintenance responsibilities of this trail within city limits.

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the Wasilla City Council and Mayor request the Alaska Congressional Delegation through Senator Ted Stevens to appropriate \$500,000 for the acquisition and construction of a multiple-use Wasilla to Big Lake Trail.
