WHEREAS, the City of Wasilla agrees to use the 2005 Technology Grant for Mobile Data Solutions for Public Safety.



**SUMMARY STATEMENT:** This Mobile Data Grant will be used for the purpose of adding computers to the police cars, along with transmitting and receiving capability. Basically, the officers would have their desktop computing capability in the patrol units.

The items that this grant will fund are; host site hardware, tower site hardware, mobile hardware for twenty-five vehicles, Internet Protocol licenses, Internet protocol gateway license, extended warranty/service agreements, technical services and shipping costs. There will also be consultant and project management costs to cover.
