A RESOLUTION OF THE WASILLA CITY COUNCIL SUPPORTING THE ALASKA NATURAL GAS DEVELOPMENT AUTHORITY RIGHT-OF-WAY LEASE

APPLICATION.

WHEREAS, the Alaska Natural Gas Development Authority (ANGDA) proposes

to construct a one hundred and forty-eight mile spur line to transport natural gas from

Glennallen to Palmer; and

WHEREAS, the Alaska Natural Gas Development Authority has submitted a

Right-of Way lease application to the Department of Natural Resources in accordance

with AS 38.35.050 for the proposed natural gas spur line; and

WHEREAS, the proposed natural gas spur line generally follows the Glenn

Highway from Glennallen to Palmer with approximately 86 miles of the line located on

State land; and

WHEREAS, Wasilla's unique location has helped make it the economic center of

the Mat-Su Valley with a market area that extends far beyond the city limits serving

more than 70,000 people who reside in the core area of the Matanuska-Susitna

Borough, and

WHEREAS, the January 2003 edition of the Alaska Economic Trends,

highlighted the vigorous growth occurring in the Mat-Su Valley stating that the

unmatched growth has "attracted the attention of Alaska, national retailers, service

providers, developers, and others seeking business opportunities;" and

WHEREAS, the future economic health of the City of Wasilla and of the Mat-Su Valley are dependent on the availability of a reliable and inexpensive natural gas supply; and

WHEREAS, upon approval of the Right-of-Way lease by the Department of Natural Resources, the Alaska Natural Gas Development Authority proposes to begin construction in the summer of 2006, with an estimated construction time of 12 to 24 months, a natural gas spur line which will provide a reliable source of natural gas to Wasilla and the core area of the Matanuska-Susitna Borough.

SUMMARY STATEMENT:

The Alaska Department of Natural Resources received a request from the Alaska Natural Gas Development Authority to process a right-of-way application to allow construction of a natural gas spur line from Glennallen to Palmer. The Department of Natural Resources has requested public comment on the application. The proposed spur line generally follows the Glenn Highway for approximately 50 miles, where it will ascend the Squaw and Caribou Creek drainages, cross Chitna Pass and descend the Boulder Creek drainage into the Chickaloon area.

Natural gas is important to existing and future residential land use. It provides heat for thousands of homes in the valley and it is also one of the first utilities that potential business and industrial developers will look for in our community. Existing supplies of natural gas currently being utilized in south central Alaska are finite. The proposed natural gas spur line will open a new source of this valuable resource for use by the residents and businesses of Wasilla. Wasilla's support of the requested right-of way lease will assist the Department of Natural Resources in reaching a decision to approve the Alaska Natural Gas Development Authority application.
