CITY OF WASILLA RESOLUTION SERIAL NO. 06-47

A RESOLUTION OF THE WASILLA CITY COUNCIL ESTABLISHING AN ETHICS ADVISORY COMMITTEE TO DRAFT AN ETHICS CODE TO GOVERN EMPLOYEES, AND APPOINTED AND ELECTED OFFICIALS OF THE CITY OF WASILLA.

WHEREAS, the City of Wasilla wishes to adopt an ethics code to govern all city

employees, including at-will employees, and elected and appointed officials; and

WHEREAS, the Council has determined to create a temporary Ethics Advisory

Committee composed of members of the community, City elected officials, a City board

or commission member and City employees, to prepare a draft of an ethics code for

consideration by the Council; and

WHEREAS, the Ethics Advisory Committee shall have advisory functions only,

and shall not otherwise act, individually or collectively, as an agent of the City; and

WHEREAS, the Ethics Advisory Committee is being formed for a special purpose

of limited duration, and shall terminate not later than 150 days after the date of its first

meeting; and

WHEREAS, members of the Ethics Advisory Committee will receive no

compensation for their service.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the Wasilla City Council:

Section 1. An Ethics Advisory Committee is established, consisting of seven

members, two of whom shall be Council members; three of whom shall be registered

City voters, including at least one member of the planning or parks and recreation

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commission; and two of whom shall be City staff members. The Ethics Advisory

Committee shall draft an ethics code for submission to the Wasilla City Council that will

govern all employees, including at-will employees, and appointed and elected officials of

the City of Wasilla.

Section 2. The Ethics Advisory Committee shall meet and organize within two

weeks after the appointments of all of its members have been confirmed, shall submit

its draft of an ethics code to the Wasilla City Council no later than 120 days after its first

meeting, and shall terminate no later than 150 days after its first meeting.

Section 3. The Ethics Advisory Committee shall be subject to the provisions of

WMC Chapter 2.44 that apply to a committee formed by resolution for a special purpose

of limited duration.

Section 4. The City Attorney, City Clerk, Deputy Clerk, Mayor, and Deputy

Administrator may assist and participate in the discussions of the Ethics Advisory

Committee, as needed.

Section 5. The City Clerk is directed to advertise for applicants to the Ethics

Advisory Committee and submit the names to the Mayor for consideration of

appointment.
